# Sebring Village PWS Has Levels of TTHM above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently violated the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for TTHM. The average level of TTHM over the last four quarters was 0.082 mg/L. The standard for TTHM is 0.080 mg/L. Although this fourth quarter monitoring period's running average was 0.082 mg/L, this was a reduction of 0.011 mg/L as reported for the third quarter's average level over the last four quarters.

#### What should I do?

You do not need to use an alternative (e.g., bottled) water supply. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

#### What does this mean?

The levels detected do not pose an immediate risk to your health. However, some people who drink water containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous systems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

### What is being done?

With the hope of co-operation by the Village of Beloit and our continued/expanded investigative procedures, we are taking the necessary steps to correct the problem as soon as possible.
